

Rules and Regulations:

1. Everyone who uses the pool does so at his or her own risk; neither Great Oaks Homeowners Association nor the pool management company is responsible for accidents or injury.
2. The pool is for the private use of Great Oaks residents and their invited guests. Anyone else using the pool or its facilities is trespassing.
3. Homeowners must sign the pool register, indicating the number of residents and the number of guests.
4. No dogs, cats or other pets are permitted in the pool area.
5. Persons with contagious diseases or open sores or wounds are not permitted to use the pool.
6. No glass is permitted in the pool area.
7. No running is permitted in the pool area.
8. A shower is required before entering the pool.
9. No loud music or boisterous conduct, which disturbs others using the pool, is permitted.
10. A responsible adult must accompany and supervise all children under the age of 12.
11. Management (the Board of Directors) reserves the right to exclude anyone from using the pool for serious or continuing violation of the rules and regulations.
12. Infants are not allowed in the pool, except in diapers specially designed for pool use.

Pool Parties

1. Homeowners desiring to sponsor pool parties must receive permission from the Management (Board of Directors). The request must include the desired date, time, number of guests (adult and children), and name of the person responsible for the party.
2. Adult supervision must be provided at all times. Party sponsors will be held responsible for the conduct of their guests.
3. Party activities, except for swimming, will be confined to the pool house deck. No food or beverages will be allowed in the pool area proper. Party sponsors will be responsible for cleanup following their event.
4. Parties may be scheduled only during regular pool hours; the pool will not be closed but will remain open for other Great Oaks residents during the party. The GOHA Board notes that, since weekends are the normal periods of high pool usage, residents should consider scheduling pool parties on weekdays.
5. One lifeguard is on duty during normal pool operating hours. Pool party sponsors will be responsible for paying the salary for additional lifeguard(s) if the anticipated number of party attendees represents an overload for the regular lifeguard. The Board of Directors will consult the pool management company to determine when additional lifeguards are appropriate.
